### **Geoffrey Chaucer**

Kent, the County in which Canterbury is located He served as a Justice of the Peace for Kent, living in debt, and was then appointed Clerk of the Works at various holdings of the King, including Westminster and the Tower of London After retiring in the early 1390s, he worked primarily on The Canterbury Tales, which he had started writing around
